



We're smart, maybe our offices shouldn't be so bright.

If your office has two switches for overhead lighting, consider turning on just one and ensuring that they are turned off when you leave the room.

The average computer left on all day uses nearly 1,000 kilowatt hours of electricity a year, producing more than a ton of carbon emissions. So turn off your computer and peripherals anytime you're not using them for extended periods of time, and eliminate the screen saver function, which uses more energy than the sleep mode.

Go "unplugged." Electronics can still draw power when in standby mode and when turned off. Consider using a power strip to cut power to all your electronics in one easy flip of the switch.
